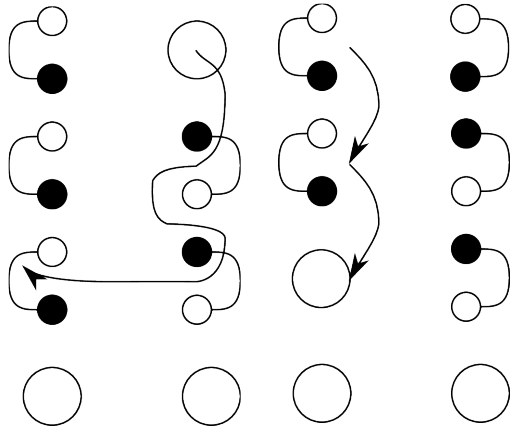
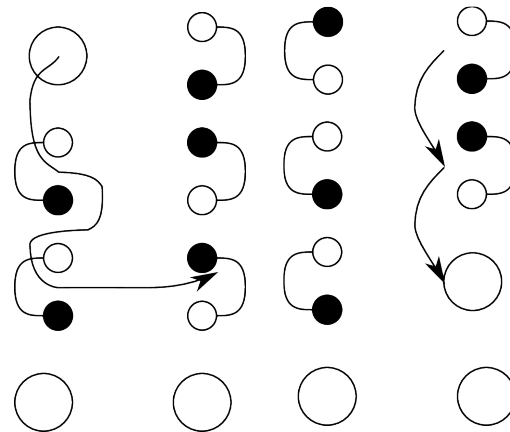


Square - split into two braids, useful for buttonholes



Step 1: A right goes through B and C right to pick up C left unreversed.

Step 2: Lower the loops on the left hand.



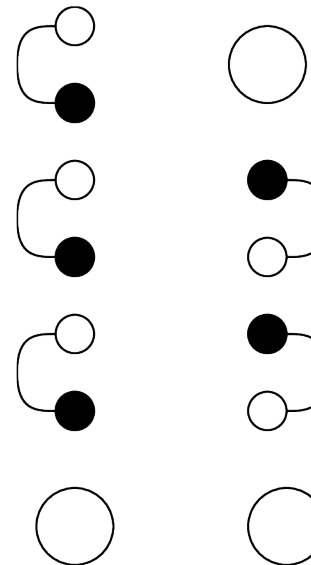
Step 3: A left goes through B and C left to pick up C right unreversed.

Step 4: Lower the loops on the right hand.

Finger Loop Braiding

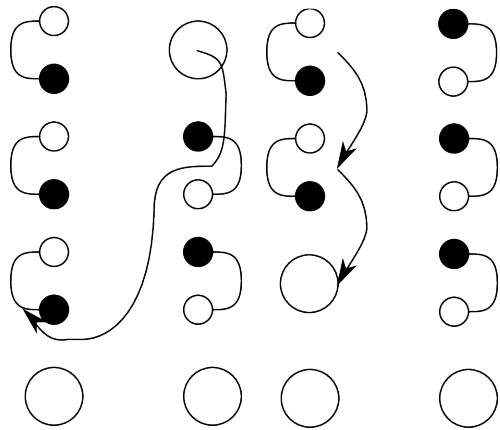
3 braids using five loops, all with the same

Fingerloop braiding is a method of making trim or braids that uses loops of thread held around the fingers of both hands. The fingers are labeled A (for the forefinger) through D (the pinkie finger). The ACTIVE finger will pick up a loop from one of the other fingers, after going through one or more loops. In the diagrams, the loops are bicoloured to emphasize which end of the loop is picked up.



To SETUP, measure five equal lengths of string. Fold them in half, and tie all the loose ends together, thus creating five loops. Anchor the knotted end, and slip one loop over A, B, and C on the left hand, and B and C on the right hand.

Flat on one side, round on the other

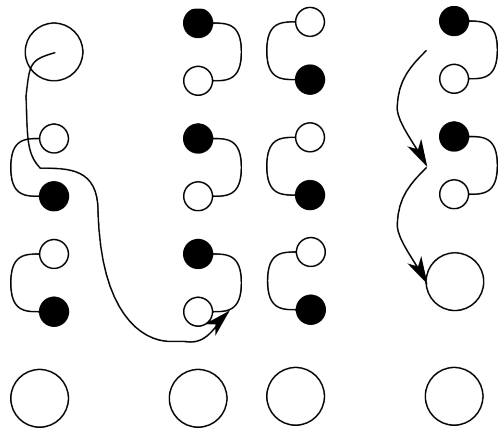


Step 1: A right goes through B right to pick up C left reversed.

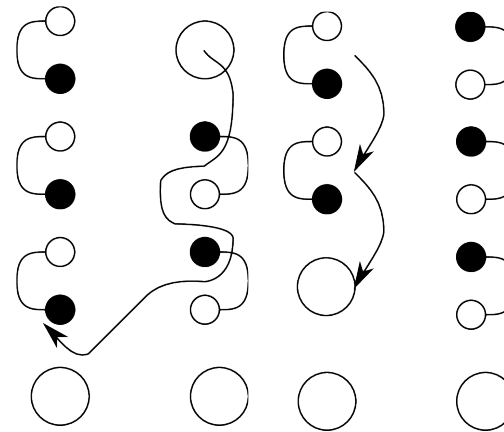
Step 2: Lower the loops on the left hand.

Step 3: A left goes through B left to pick up C right reversed.

Step 4: Lower the loops on the right hand.



Square



Step 1: A right goes through B and C right to pick up C left reversed.

Step 2: Lower the loops on the left hand.

Step 3: A left goes through B and C left to pick up C right reversed.

Step 4: Lower the loops on the right hand.
